

Pupil Premium at Street Lane Primary School 2012/13

Pupil Premium Allocation

In April 2011 the Coalition Government introduced the Pupil premium. This is funding allocated to schools which is additional to main school funding. Fundamentally, this additional funding was designed to narrow the attainment gap between students from disadvantaged families and their peers, where this exists. Schools can choose how to target these additional funds in order to meet the needs of students at risk of under-achieving based on their circumstances.

“It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium allocated to schools per Free School Meal pupil, is spent since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility”

All schools are required to publish online information about how they have used the Premium and its impact on the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium.

For the academic year 2012/2013 Street Lane Primary School received £ 14400 as the Pupil Premium allocation.

In 2012/2013 Pupil Premium helped provide for:

Additional Teaching Assistant support for reading, writing & mathematics in Class 1 and 2

A teacher to provide support for reading, writing & mathematics in class 3.

The money is allocated to initiatives in school to ensure that pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

These additional support systems are being monitored and analysed so we can ensure we are successful in promoting pupil attainment and progress. ALL children are closely tracked against National expected levels to ensure the highest possible personal progress is made.

If your child does not have Free School Meals, but may be eligible because of your family's income level, please contact the school office and they will help you to register them. Even if you do not wish your child to have the meals, this would mean the school could claim additional Pupil Premium funding to be used to support your child.
