English

In this term's English lessons, we will be focussing on the book 'Rose Blanche' which is about a little German girl that makes friends with a boy in a concentration camp and gets caught up in the war:

Linked to our History lessons, we will then be writing narrative extracts from different characters' perspectives and diary entries.

Within these lessons, the children will also be taught grammar that links to the pieces that they are writing. The grammar terminology can be quite challenging for them so our SP&G classroom posters are available on the website for support if needed at home.

Art, Design Technology

As well as making periscopes linked to our World War topic, we will be exploring how we can use drawing and different materials to create mixed media self-portraits.

Science

As part of the National Curriculum the children have to learn about different types of scientific enquiry. This half term we will be using the different types to answer the following questions:

Is there a pattern between what we eat for breakfast and how fast we can run?

How could we group and classify liquorice allsorts?

How does sugar affect yeast?


How could the soldiers look over the trenches without getting injured? Who was Alan Turing? What impact did he have on World War 2? How can we get light through a maze without moving the light source?

History

Our lessons on World War II will focus on the following curriculum questions:

- How did World War 1 end and World War 2 begin?
- Was it necessary for children to be evacuated?
- How was Britain able to stand firm against the German threat?
- Britain at war. The Home Front Why is it so difficult to be sure what life was really like on the Home Front?
- What else happened around the world during World War 2?
- How did World War Two end?
- What was VE Day really like?

To support this we will be using a range of beautiful books, including Skyward: The Story of Female Pilots and Tales of World War II: Amazing True Stories from the War that Shook the World.
